Description

Renders complete package reference manual in HTML format.

Usage

Arguments

package	name of the package
outdir	where to put the html file
link_cb	callback function which can be used to customize hyperlinks to other packages. This function gets invoked when a help file contains links to another package, and should return the URL to the html reference manual for this other package. Set to NULL to drop cross-package links.

Details
